We are checking your Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application. Federal rules require that we do this to make sure only eligible children get free or reduced price meals. You must send us information to prove that Laine Brugger, Zamir Brugger, Kyne Brugger, Gale Littlefield are eligible. If possible, send copies, not original papers. If you do send originals, they will be sent back to you only if you ask.

1. If you were getting SNAP or TANF when you applied for free or reduced price meals, or at any time since then, send us a copy of one of these:

- SNAP or TANF Certification Notice that shows dates of certification.
- Letter from SNAP or Welfare Office that says you have gotten SNAP or TANF.
- **Do not send your EBT card.**

2. If you get this letter for a homeless, migrant or runaway child, please contact, the school, Jane Johnson (Homeless coordinator), Jane Johnson (Migrant coordinator), or Peter Williams (Runaway coordinator) for help.

3. If the child is a Foster Child:

- Send us official documentation from the agency sponsoring the child.

4. If you do not get SNAP or TANF for your children:

Acceptable papers include:

Jobs: Paycheck stub or pay envelope that shows the amount and how often pay is received; letter from employer stating gross wages and how often they are paid; or business or farming papers, such as ledger or tax books.

Social Security, Pensions, or Retirement: Social Security retirement benefit letter, statement of benefits received, or pension award notice.

Unemployment, Disability, or Worker's Comp: Notice of eligibility from State employment security office, check stub, or letter from Worker's Compensation.

Welfare Payments: Benefit letter from welfare agency.

Child Support or Alimony: Court decree, agreement, or copies of checks received.

Other income (such as rental income): Information that shows the amount of income received, how often it is received, and the date received.

No income: A brief note explaining how you provide food, clothing and housing for your household, and when you expect an income.

Military Housing Privatization Initiative: Letter or rental contract showing that your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative.

Timeframe of Acceptable Income Documentation:

Please submit papers that show your income at the time that you applied for benefits. If you do not have this information, you may submit papers from time of application up to time of verification.

Privacy Act Statement: The Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act requires the information on this application. You do not have to give the information, but if you do not, we cannot approve your child for free or reduced price meals. You must include the social security number of all adult household members. The social security number is not required when you apply on behalf of a foster child or you list a SNAP Program, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Program or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) case number or other FDPIR identifier for your child or when you indicate that the adult household member signing the application does not have a social security number. We will use your information to determine if your child is eligible for free or reduced price meals, and for administration and enforcement of the lunch and breakfast programs.
